1. Communication / Letters that addressed key issues

Segment 1 update sequence by date: 5 April

Monday,5th April

IATO President sought the help of Dr. P K Mishra, Principal Secretary to Hon'ble Prime Minister of India for the Inbound Tourism Industry and the release of SEIS 2019/20 under Foreign Trade Policy 2015-20

IATO President requested Dr. P K Mishra Principal Secretary to Hon'ble Prime Minister of India to kindly help IATO to impress upon the Ministry of Finance / Ministry of Commerce / DGFT to announce and release the SEIS Scrips for the year 2019-20 as SEIS is the only hope, that shall help tour operators to survive and revive their business.

IATO also requested for an appointment with Dr P K Mishra at the earliest possible as per date and time convenient to him.

➤ IATO President wrote to Mr. Rajiv Bansal, Chairman and Managing Director Air India regarding refund of Cancelled Air tickets due to Covid -19 and Hon'ble Supreme Court Ruling

IATO President addressed the issue that though Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has passed judgment directing DGCA and the domestic airlines regarding refund on cancellation of air tickets during Covid and a circular was issued by the Director General Civil Aviation for the refund stating that the last date for receiving refund in physical form was 31st March 2021, but the travel agents'/tour operators who had booked air tickets on Air India had not received the refund so far.

Those who had taken advance from their foreign tour operators/foreign tourists are under extreme pressure to refund the advance they had received from them for booking of air tickets and other arrangements for their visit to India but could not visit India country due to Visa Restrictions and restrictions on International flight.

President IATO sought an appointment with Mr Rajiv Bansal on the above issue.

President IATO sought the help of the Hon'ble Minister of State for Finance & Corporate Affairs on two key issues

- **2.** Request to withdraw Levy of Tax Collection at Source (TCS) on sale of overseas tour program package to foreign tourists from 01.10.2020.

Team IATO met the concerned officials from the Ministry of Tourism, ADG Tourism, discussed key issues and offered suggestions on

This will lead to better selection of FTOs, spacing of visits between countries so that IATO members have time to conduct their marketing after the road show and centrally located hotels.

- · Scheme to incentivise FTOs who would get tourists.
- Priority Vaccinations for tourism professionals
- **MDA Scheme:** Rs 2 Cr min turnover should be removed as it rules our small tour operators. IATO has already addressed this issue through written communication and discussions with authorities.
- **MOT Recognition of Tour Operators:** Certified course from THSC (Tourism Hospitality & Skill Council) to be considered as the required qualification for staff at the office of a tour operator.

- To clear all pending application with the Ministry for renewal.
